

 - b. The doctor would measure the angle of the man's erection. Research has demonstrated that men with "downward" curving erections are strongly likely to have erectile disorder. Treatment options would involve surgery or a penis cast to straighten the penis.
 - c. The doctor would order the man to begin having sex only in the missionary position (man on top of the woman). The doctor would also advise the man to NOT masturbate lying down. The doctor wants the man to use positions that don't drain blood from the penis but instead allow more blood flow to the penis.
 - d. The doctor would want to rule out psychological issues as a cause. He would arrange for the client to have sex with a "sexual surrogate", a woman who is trained in the art of lovemaking. The idea is that if a man can't maintain an erection with woman trained in how to give a man sexual pleasure, then the man's problem is biological.
